OUR VISION

LUNI Lombok stands for the Love of Unwanted, Neglected and Ill-treated animals on the Gili Islands.

We envision a future where all Gili animals are respected and live a happy and healthy life in harmony with the community.



WHAT WE DO

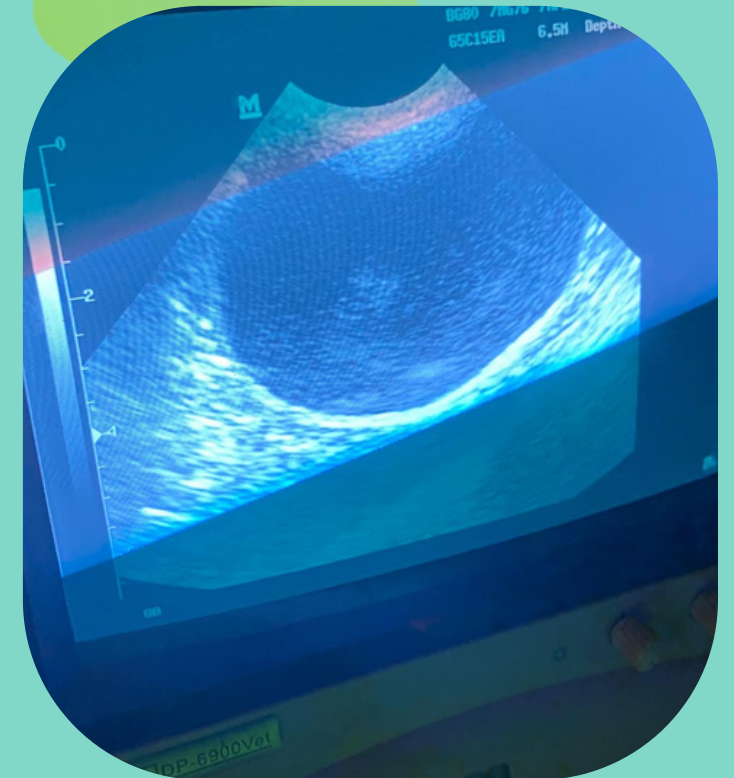
LUNI Lombok enhances animal welfare through direct care, prevention, and community programs, including:

- Operating two nonprofit veterinary clinics on Gili Trawangan and Gili Air, offering free treatment and sterilization for homeless animals and affordable care for pets and livestock.
- Delivering TNVR (Trap–Neuter–Vaccinate–Return) pop-up clinics across the islands
- Feeding and monitoring over 1,000 island cats daily through our Pussy Patrol
- Installing and maintaining drinking water stations for cats and wildlife
- Conducting weekly welfare checks for free-living cow and deer population
- Rescuing, treating, and rehabilitating wildlife
- Running a Cat Café featuring rescued kittens and disabled cats, along with a shop for pet supplies and souvenirs to promote adoption and education



KEY ACHIEVEMENTS & ORGANISATIONAL HIGHLIGHTS

- Clinic Expansion: Opened the LUNITO Gili Air Clinic in April, enhancing service availability.
- Veterinary Initiatives: Launched weekly free spay days, introduced a vaccination program, and delivered 10 TNVR pop-up clinics across the islands.
- Community Engagement: Initiated the “Sponsor a Warung” program (feeding stations) to foster long-term support from local businesses and conducted our first community outreach with cow owners on Gili Air.
- Advancements in Care: Invested in critical diagnostic equipment, trained local veterinarians and vet nurses, and maintained strong collaborations with international organizations.
- Financial Support: Secured significant grants and donations from partners including Animals Australia and Cold Noses.



PROGRAMME IMPACT & SERVICE DELIVERY

VETERINARY CARE

Throughout 2025, our clinics treated a high volume of homeless animals, locally owned cats and privately owned pets. Income from full-paying clients directly subsidised free care for homeless animals. Preventative care remained a priority, supported by volunteer veterinarians who mentored and trained our team, enabling consistently high medical standards.

STERILISATION & POPULATION CONTROL

Sterilisation remained a cornerstone of our work, delivered both through daily clinic operations and TNVR pop-up clinics across all three islands. These interventions continue to be the most effective tool for long-term population control.

FEEDING & WATER PROGRAMMES

Daily feeding routes supported over 1000 island cats, with food, water and health monitoring. In 2025, three new warungs were implemented on Gili Trawangan and six on Gili Air, bringing the total number to 41 feeding stations alongside year-round maintenance of all our warungs as well as water stations for wildlife and larger animals.

WILDLIFE & LARGE ANIMAL CARE

LUNI Lombok provided treatment, monitoring, rescue and rehabilitation for wildlife and large animals including deer, snakes, bats, squirrels, cows, goats and horses. Regular welfare checks allowed early intervention and reduced unnecessary suffering.

LOOKING AHEAD TO 2026

OUR PRIORITIES FOR THE COMING YEAR INCLUDE:

- Securing a permanent full-time local veterinarian for Gili Air
- Expanding TNVR pop-up clinics across the islands
- Identifying land to build a permanent Cat Café and clinic on Gili Air
- Introducing advanced procedures and diagnostics (for example epidurals, cystotomies and PU surgery) through training with Vets Beyond Borders
- Expanding the Sponsor a Warung programme
- Starting animal welfare education programmes in local schools
- Supporting low-income cow owners with education and feed during the dry season
